Ultimately, it means travelling all alone.





This institute produced teachers with high ideals, morals, dedication, sincerity, hard work and so on and is still in service of the mankind. But with the changing scenario and unstoppable development it is difficult to keep our values intact and morality is at its verge. In this alarming situation teachers role become most significant.

Take a copy of 'Resonance (Mauj-E-Sada)' with deep and strong emotions, clear voice, foresighted vision, complete determination and full confidence that every one of us is an important player to bring back our society's core values which we have lost in materialistic society. In the era of technological advancement the value of printed material is declining and importance of writing is losing its identity which is another reason of disappearance of core values. It is true that today world is in our pocket and that computer, internet, mobile etc are some wonderful invention of today's man.

Presently knowledge can be accessed on finger tips; any type of information is available through search engines. Facilities available through development enrich our day to day life. I still remember the days of my student's life. There was no xerox machine, no computer, no internet, no mobile and we used to keep on search books for hours to find out a single topic, carbon papers to make copies and the only way to reach people outside our city was MTNL seva which was too costly and not available easily in those days. When I joined this college there was no telephone facility in the premises and we had to travel 1 to 2 kilometer to make a call. Today everything is in our reach and at our palm.

Unfortunately in the intensity of shiny development and advancement our values are disappearing. We blame 'Corruption and Development' for our declining values. We must not forget that 'Corruption and Development' are the two sides of the same coin. Corruption is not new to this world. Centuries ago, messengers and reformers raised their voices against corruption. Rousseau, a great philosopher, who wrote number of articles against corrupt society and his writings were the main reason behind French revolution, he had an opinion that corruption is because we are not following the nature and going against its wishes. In those days corruption was in the corridors of politics but today corruption is rooted everywhere including education. It is very dangerous and a matter of concern. Today education is on sale; education has become a comfortable and profitable business. Money has captured whole industry of education. Honesty, sincerity, truth, good deeds, kindness, love, affection, respect, sympathy, justice are some inborn qualities of teachers but today's teacher is far away from all these qualities. Teachers are responsible for declining values to some extent if not fully. On the contrary the only silver lining in the clouds is the teacher who can be the true saver of our society's values.

It is said that, "teaching profession is a noble profession." It is true but it requires unlimited and unfinished characteristics and qualities to become a noble teacher such as self confidence and self respect, excellent appearance, healthy and energetic, good intellect, high character, sense of humour, optimistic, democratic, fair and just, sympathy and empathy, punctuality, regularity, enthusiasm, industriousness, etc. Teaching profession demands some Personal and Social values such as love, patience, courtesy, sharing, forgiveness, loyalty, devotion, good manners, repentance, gratitude, tolerance, responsibility, determination, service, positive approach, brotherhood, accountability, punctuality, justice, equality, honesty, sincerity, coordination, discipline, ambition, dedication, truthfulness, creativity, etc. and above all respect for elders, love and affection for younger, and faith in colleagues.

We should not enter in teaching profession unless we love it. It has no promise of wealth and fame, but they to whom it is dear for its own sake are among the nobility of mankind. We sing in the praise of the unknown teacher who is king of himself and leader of the mankind. This, we may say, is the philosophical meaning of teacher, but is very relevant.

Teacher plays his role as technician in the society. For a technician things should be at proper condition and all faults should be corrected. A technician loves the things which are not working properly or damaged. He puts all his efforts to bring the things in proper condition. He takes pain to give new life to a non living thing. Usually or sometimes he sacrifices his life for his devoted love for his profession. A teacher's life is the best example of sacrifice, love, affection, dedication and so on. He is the architect of nation's builders. As Kothari Commission rightly said that the "destiny of nation is being built in classrooms". A child or student is the reflection of his teacher's personality. His roles are multifaceted. For a teacher, life of a child should be more important than content. 



REMEMBER WHAT YOU STAND FOR !



Captain Vikram Batra was an officer of the Indian army. During the Kargil war, he sacrificed his life while trying to save one of his officers. His officer had got injured by the bullets being fired from the top of a cliff-rock. Someone had to go to get him to safety putting his own life into risk. Captain Batra didn't allow anyone else to go. He went ahead himself and was killed as he shielded his officer into the bunker. For his bravery and sacrifice, he was posthumously awarded the Param Vir Chakra - India's highest military award.

Captain Batra's life is an inspiration for us. He was a leader in true sense. He could have ordered someone else to go and get the injured official but he took the risk for himself.

While remembering heroes like Captain Batra, we should think about one aspect: what drives some people to do such exemplary acts? To my mind, they are focussed on their goal always. The goal drives them to put in their best. To them, the goal is bigger than everything and this commitment makes them overcome hurdle, face adversities and do anything possible even if it means risking their lives. Secondly, they pursue their goals based on principles. They always remember what they stand for. For captain Batra, the safety of nation came first, followed by safety of his team. His own safety came last.

Those who keep complaining about problems at their workplace should think about the life of uniform personnel. They perform their duty at the risk of their life. Can there be any problem bigger than the life- risking situations? Our workplace issues will seem trivial in comparison to a fire man risking his life to control fire, a police man trying to diffuse a bomb, an army man protecting the border and fighting a war. For us being in the line of fire may be just a phrase, think of those for whom it is a reality.







MISSILE MAN - DR. A P J ABDUL KALAM

Philosopher - Scientist and a Great Inspiration:

Maulana Wahiduddin Khan

A P J Abdul Kalam, former President of India, was a man of integrity. Intellectually, he was a scientific in temper and morally, a very humble person. He was born into a poor South Indian family which could not even afford to pay his school fees. But he worked very hard and continued with his education, and consequently went on to become a highly respected aerospace scientist in the country.

Abdul Kalam was not 'born with a silver spoon in his mouth'; yet he was born with a great 'incentive spoon' which was responsible for his tremendous success. His self-motivation and high ideals helped him, and he rose to the highest office of the country. Kalam's life has a very significant lesson, that is, that people's categorisation into rich and poor or haves and have-nots is unrealistic. The real categorisation is that people are either actual haves or potential haves. Those who today apparently belong to the category of have-nots can convert their potential into actuality, and thus enter the category of haves.

Kalam ones said that, "If a country is to be corruption-free and become a nation of beautiful minds, I strongly feel there are three key societal members who can make a difference. They are the father, mother and teacher." This statement is a correct analysis of nation-building, because a person develops his personality in his formative period, during which he is under the supervision of his parents and teachers. If these three members of society resolve to guide the child in the right direction, then within one generation the whole situation of India will undergo a drastic change.

Regarding youth, Kalam said: "My message, especially to young people, is to have courage to think differently, to invent, to travel the unexplored path, discover the impossible and to overcome problems and succeed. These are great qualities that they must work towards." If we express these qualities in one word, it can be said that young people should make 'excellence' their goal; they should not accept anything less than striving for the excellent. In doing so, not only will they reach great heights of success, but will also be able to reform society along constructive lines.

It is said that even amidst his tight schedule, Kalam found time to put pen to paper, almost every day. This is a very creative habit because if a person restricts himself only to routine office work, he will experience intellectual stagnation. However, if he makes time for reading and writing, his intellectual development will go unhindered.

Kalam once also said: "India has a message for the world that religion could be transformed into a mighty spiritual force." This is without doubt a realistic statement, because India has traditionally been a country of high spiritual values. If India develops in spirituality, it will certainly become a lighthouse of spirituality for the world.

When Kalam was President, a reporter who was interviewing him was referring to him as "Your Excellency". Kalam cut him short, saying, "Call me Kalam". This is the key to Kalam's personality-he was modest to the core. His message is: **Be modest and you will achieve success.**

- He was responsible for the development and operationalizing of AGNI and PRITHIVI Missiles.
- He played a crucial role in building indigenous capability in critical technologies, collaborating with multiple institutions.
- He was Scientific Advisor to Defence Minister and Secretary, DRDO from July 1992 to December 1999.
- He was the man behind the weaponization of strategic missile systems and the Pokhran-II nuclear tests in collaboration with DAE, which made INDIA a NUCLEAR WEAPON STATE.
- He served as Principal Scientific Advisor to government of India, as Cabinet Minister from November 1999 to November 2001, responsible for policies, strategies and missions for many development applications.
- He has been awarded Padma Bhushan in 1981, Padma Vibhushan in 1990 and the highest civilian award BHARAT RATNA in 1997.
- He served as 11th President of India from July 25, 2002 to July 25, 2007.
- He was the first vegetarian bachelor to occupy RASHTRAPATI BHAWAN.
- His books are: India 2020 in 1998, Wings of Fire in 1999, Ignited Minds in 2002, Guiding Souls: Dialogues on the purpose of Life in 2005, My journey: Transforming Dreams into Actions in 2013.

SUCCESS IS A BY PRODUCT OF DELAYED GRATIFICATION



Success is not about what you achieve. It is about achieving what you are capable of achieving. But does anyone know what he or she is capable of achieving? Not really! This is the concept that Joe De Sena presents in his book - The Spartan Up! The book is co-authored by Jeff O'Connell.

Spartan warriors of ancient Greece have inspired generations. They trained hard for years. Their motto was: never be satisfied with what you achieve. In 1972, Walter Mischel, a Stanford researcher, gave his child subjects their preferred treat-a marshmallow, cookie, or pretzel but with a choice: They could eat the treat right away or wait 15 minutes, at which point they could receive two. The researchers found that those kids who were willing to postpone gratification became more successful adults than those kids who couldn't. Joe puts it well: success is a by product of delayed gratification. This is so true. When we look around we find so many people who look successful, yet they are not happy. They are not happy because they have not realized their full potential. They felt satisfied too early in life, stopped running after achieving a milestone.

True, going to the next level requires one to try harder, face discomforts and cross hurdles. According to a racing proverb, "You run the first half with your legs, the second half with your mind." Joe says, "his book is really about the second half of the race". When it is asked him to illustrate this point further, he said, "No matter how fit I was at any point in my life, I have hit a wall with my body and endurance... when I do my mind needs to take over. I did not want to take another step...then my partner collapsed and wanted to be left in the snow...I tied him to me and pulled him through the snow to the next town. I didn't have the energy to this but my mind did!"

You may not win every race or overcome every obstacle but each attempt can be a profound learning experience. Joe's ideas are not just tips from a self-help guru. REFRESHING THE MIND

It is generally recognized that the present system does not provide opportunities for the professional development of the teachers. It is also recognized that a teacher is pivot of educational system. Teaching is no longer merely an art. Newer methods of teaching and educational technology have made the job of a teacher exact and demanding. In every academic discipline there has been knowledge explosion. A teacher has to continuously update his knowledge in his chosen field of expertise, or take the risk of becoming totally outdated in every short period of time. While the really motivated teacher uses his own resources to keep



himself abreast of new knowledge, and to train himself in the latest methodologies and techniques of teaching, it is necessary to provide systematic guidelines and organized Refresher Courses for the large number of teachers at the school level.

It is observed that teachers are so strict with their old methods of teaching and it is also true that opportunities are not provided to them. To Keep all those factors in mind and rapid pace of advancement of technologies in education, the Anjuman-I-Islam's Akbar Peerbhoy College of Education started a Refresher Course in 1998 with the following objectives:-

- To provide opportunities for the professional development of the teacher.
- To acquaint with the new methods and technologies of teaching.
- 3. To update the knowledge of the teacher in his field.
- To organize especially designed refresher in teaching methodology, pedagogy and new techniques.
- 5. To fulfill the requirement of NAAC under IQAC National Integration



Till date we have completed Nine Refresher Courses for Teachers of Anjuman-I-Islam. Initially the duration of the courses was 12 days. Now it is reduced to six days. We invite Resource Persons from different fields of education. Our faculty also conducts various sessions.

TEACHERS' EVALUATION PROGRAMME

The present need is greatly on how the teacher can understand the demand of the child-the understanding of the learning disability. Generally it has been found that the teacher is only oriented with the child's textbook and not with his inability to understand what is being taught to him in class. We feel: -

- 1. How many teachers are really reading before going to class is the next priority?
- 2. Are Projects given sincerely to the child as a course of study or just to kill time?

- 3. Do teachers plan lesson or is it only kept in the B.Ed. files?
- 4. How many of us realize the need to give good thought provoking worksheets to the class so that the child is doing learning activity.
- 5. The need to send students to a counselor is urgent and not superfluous- to do this teacher must have interpersonal relationship with class.
- 6. Accountability not only to the class but to self-because now school and education is in the focus of the private sector. The child is the Consumer and Client- not the slave.

 - Basically, human beings are trustworthy, and operate in an atmosphere of mutual trust.
 - Freedom is a basic ingredient of creativity and creativity begets creativity.



SELF INSTRUCTIONS



Self-instruction can be defined as the ability of one to cognitively plan, organize, direct, reinforce, and evaluate ones own independent learning without a teacher's prompting. There are three powerful influences behind self-instruction: First the learning and modelling of materials, Second the ability of verbalization, and finally, self-regulation

The use of imagery, which is fundamental in the development of ones cognitive processing, is among the many connections that can be made through Distance Education.

In Self-instruction as in Distance Education numerous threads are required so that the learner can achieve his or her ultimate mastery of the subject.

One can see that the learner is not locked directly into one thread for method of learning. With self-instruction the learner also was able to change the direction of learning as necessary so that the mastery of the materials was achieved.

The following steps outline the components of a self-instructional procedure.

Step 1: Identify the problem

This step involves identifying and stating the problem that needs to be solved. For example, if a person is hungry and wants something to eat, the problem might be, "I'm hungry." A fast food employee might have multiple responsibilities making it difficult to remember some components of the job. For example, the problem might be, "The napkin holder is empty."

Step 2: Identify a possible response to the problem

This step requires determining and stating a solution to the problem. The solution might vary depending upon the situation. For example, hunger might be addressed differently depending upon time of day and location. The self-instructional procedure may also be developed to address a specific time of day or circumstance. In this case, the self-instructional procedure may be relevant to lunch time.

A possible response to the problem of being hungry at lunch time might be, "I'll fix a sandwich." The appropriate response for a fast food employee with the empty napkin holder might be, "Fill the napkin holder."

Step 3: Evaluate the response

The consumer would state, "I fixed myself a sandwich" or "I refilled the napkin holder." The consumer will need to determine if he or she actually did what he or she said they would do. "I fixed the sandwich because I was hungry."

Step 4: Self-reinforce

The consumer should verbally acknowledge that they got the job done. Something like, "Great, I'm no longer hungry" or "Good, I took care of it."

Another model of self-instruction includes the Did-Next-Now strategy. It is particularly useful for teaching a series of tasks in sequence. The consumer would state the response just completed (Did), what they were doing next (Next), and an instruction to do it now (Now).

An example of this strategy might include a sequence like, "I wiped the table. I need to fill the napkin holders. I will fill the napkin holders now!" A description of the Did-Next-Now strategy and other self-instructional strategies can be found in Hughes (1997).
