

### Peer Group Mentoring (PGM)

## Action Research

Action research means reviewing one classroom practices with the intention of understanding and improving it. It is a teacher-initiated classroom investigation which s/he acquires a deep understanding of classroom teaching and is ready and motivated enough to bring about the required changes.

It is a form of self-reflective inquiry undertaken by participants in social (including educational) situations in order to improve the rationality and justice of

- a) their own social or educational practices
- b) their understanding of these practices
- c) the situations in which these practices are carried out.

Thus, action research is a reflective activity based on a critical understanding of teaching practice committed towards its improvement and appears as an effective tool of professional development for teachers.
